This program has helped provide a foundation for a lifetime of success for over one million children, their families, and caregivers to date, and we're proud of our progress toward our goals, as demonstrated in this report.

We're also excited about an emerging strategic philanthropic focus on financial well-being. The portfolio aims to fund transformative initiatives that foster financial stability, promote wealth building and economic mobility, and strengthen financial ecosystems in under-resourced communities. By supporting programs that focus on dignity, choice, and inclusive solutions, we hope to contribute to an environment where everyone can pursue financial wellness—especially people of color and caregivers of young children living and working in marginalized communities.

Our Community Stewardship mission

Community Stewardship invests in the well-being of children and families. We enhance Vanguard's global community impact, reputation, and internal culture of care through the strategic integration of crew volunteerism, impact-driven philanthropy, and company expertise.

With a primary focus on early childhood development and financial well-being, our collaborative approach engages nonprofit and corporate leaders to collectively address critical needs in communities where our crew and clients live.



Our community engagement

Our broader Community Stewardship portfolio includes a mix of strategic and responsive philanthropic programs and crew volunteerism to meet a range of community needs throughout the year.

Our strategic philanthropy programs are designed for the long term and with the highest impact in mind. Our responsive efforts aim to address more immediate and short-term needs in Vanguard geographies around the world, including disaster relief efforts in local communities. Crew are provided with a range of options to volunteer and make a difference at company-sponsored events—over 400 in 2023 alone—and for personal causes they care most about.

Our programs

Vanguard Community 365 offers a robust selection of programs throughout the year that celebrate, enable, and inspire our crew to support and strengthen their local communities.

Crew volunteer programs

- Skills-based Volunteering: Skills-based volunteering is designed to align crew talents, skills, and expertise to meet the needs of nonprofit organizations in our communities. These roles, which include board service and pro bono legal services, provide crew with leadership development opportunities that allow them to utilize their professional expertise to enhance the lives of individuals and improve organizational effectiveness.
- Days of Service: Days of Service provide crew the opportunity to volunteer at agencies that address important community needs such as early literacy, food insecurity, and human services. These service opportunities range from small group projects to Vanguard's Global Days of Impact that mobilize company and community volunteers for large-scale transformative events in key company geographies.

- Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA): VITA at Vanguard mobilizes and connects crew members with local nonprofit agencies to provide free income tax preparation services to eligible low-income families. Vanguard crew have been volunteering since 2003, filing thousands of tax returns, resulting in millions of dollars in federal and state refunds. The national program, Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA), is sponsored by the IRS.
- **Community Gardens:** Established in 2012, Vanguard's community gardens are planted, maintained, and harvested by crew volunteers who donate the produce raised to local food banks and pantries. Gardens in Pennsylvania and Arizona raise a variety of produce, including tomatoes, peppers, spinach, lettuce, zucchini, carrots, and eggplants.

Crew impact multiplier programs

- Matching Gift Program: Our generous Matching Gift Program incentivizes crew members to donate to company and personal causes. Vanguard matches all donations to our signature philanthropic program, Strong Start for Kids, at 100% with no cap amount. Donations to all other eligible charitable organizations are matched at 50% up to a maximum amount of \$10K per crew member, per year.
- **Dollars for Doers:** Vanguard offers a year-round Dollars for Doers program, which provides crew with a \$10 volunteer award for every hour of service up to a total of \$500 that can be designated to one or more eligible nonprofits of their choice.

• Volunteer Time Off (VTO): VTO, or volunteer time off, is one paid day per calendar year that Vanguard gives crew to dedicate to community service through volunteer work. Crew members can volunteer with any charitable agency they choose.

Annual campaigns

- Community 365 Campaign: Each Fall, Vanguard leaders from across the globe participate in the annual campaign focused on increasing crew volunteerism and financial donations to support Vanguard's signature philanthropic initiative Strong Start for Kids. In 2023 crew donated \$3.5M to Strong Start that increased early childhood outcomes for children and families and donated 21,000 hours of volunteer service.
- All Cans on Deck: The All Cans on Deck campaign supports crew-driven food and financial donations to local nonprofits committed to addressing food insecurity in communities across the globe. We donate over two million meals annually.
- **Giving Season:** Vanguard partners with local agencies to administer the Giving Season program, which enables crew at our sites to provide gifts and financial donations to families within their own communities during the holiday season.

Engaging directly with community partners

Vanguard Community 365 **inspires** our crew to maximize their impact in the community.

In focus: North Carolina

To develop high-level reading comprehension skills by the end of third grade, students need to develop both reading and listening comprehension skills.

Queen City Readers, an initiative of Strong Start for Kids partner Read Charlotte, targets foundational reading skills, including:

- Hearing sounds within words (phonemic awareness)
- Sounding out words (decoding)
- Spelling words (encoding)
- High-frequency word practice

The program was intentionally designed to be delivered by adults with little to no training or formal background in literacy or education. Volunteer tutors need only view a 15-minute training video.

During three volunteer opportunities, Vanguard crew created just over 450 tutoring binders that support a year of tutoring for students in and around Mecklenburg County. These materials will be used in settings such as schools, community-based organizations, and houses of faith.

In focus: Pennsylvania

FathersRead365 (FR365), a Strong Start for Kids partner in Philadelphia, aims to develop early literacy by encouraging fathers and caregivers to read daily with children. FR365 received a grant from Strong Start for Kids offering strategic consultation aimed at increasing administrative and organizational capacity and expanding the core early literacy and engagement activities of this critical organization.

In addition, 350 crew volunteered through our Skills-based Volunteering and Days of Service programs to design new branding, develop a social media strategy, and assemble a year's supply of bags for FR365 during an on-campus event.

FR365 will distribute the bags to childcare and community centers in the under-resourced communities of Philadelphia and South Jersey where reading events are held throughout the year.

Strong Start for Kids

Seven full years of childhood investment by Strong Start for Kids have made an impact:

\$83 million

has been provided to fund 170 projects.

Nearly 1.1 million

children and families and more than 3,200 educators have received help and resources.

Over \$41 million

has been invested in early childhood projects with intentional diversity, equity, and inclusion priorities.



Investing for impact

Strong Start for Kids is driven by decades of research demonstrating that highquality, evidence-based investments made in the first few years of a child's life lead to lifelong cognitive, emotional, and economic improvements.

When children are supported in their early years, they are more prepared to succeed in school, lead healthier lives, and strengthen their communities. Supporting nurturing home environments for infants and toddlers, high-quality classrooms, and a strong early childhood sector in our communities has never been more vital.

Our philanthropic dollars strategically target **three levers** that have a proven track record for improving school readiness in communities:

- 1. Programs that cultivate the role of parents and caregivers through one-on-one individualized and/or group experiences. These evidence-based programs help improve parenting practices and networks. They also increase critical connections to social supports that promote child health and well-being.
- Vanguard has invested \$14.8 million in home visiting organizations in Philadelphia, Charlotte, and Phoenix, providing the opportunity for over 2,250 families to receive individualized coaching in responsive, nurturing caregiving practices proven to support children to develop healthy relationships, resiliency, and kindergarten readiness. Vanguard's consistent and innovative partnerships in the home visiting sector, particularly in Philadelphia, have contributed to a transformed field since 2016.
- Early literacy skills are critical to school success. Through both small grassroots programs and large city-wide campaigns, Vanguard has funded the distribution of 1,737,565 books to early childhood centers and for families' home libraries and supported 877,618 families in learning evidence-based early literacy skills for reading at home.
- 2. Programs that support high-quality improvement, expansion, and sustainability efforts for early learning centers and foster teacher development through training, coaching, and apprenticeship programs.
- Through our partnerships with local professional development and early childhood education experts, nearly 15,000 children have benefited from new highquality childcare opportunities.

- Projects that mobilize communities by coordinating early learning systems and stakeholders and educating policymakers to advocate for more—and more equitable public funding.
- In Pennsylvania, our support has helped advocacy organizations increase state budget allocations for early childhood programs by more than \$33 million.
- We also provided support to help our Strong Start for Kids partners unlock more than \$79.5 million of private and one-time public funding for the early childhood sector.

Partnering for impact

Our work fosters partnerships to advance family support and early learning programming in the highest-need communities near Vanguard's largest corporate operations. We respect and build on local strengths to ensure that families, programs, and communities have the resources to help all children have the best possible start in life.

Strong Start's key opportunity for impact lies not just in grantmaking, but in Vanguard's ability to leverage other philanthropic assets in support of early childhood education in underserved communities.

- We advocate for increased, sustainable public funding to address racial disparities in access to high-quality services and opportunities for children of color.
- We partner with leading philanthropic and private institutions that share our vision for young children.
- We recognize the strengths of community-based organizations and seek to elevate their leadership and reach.

Strong Start for Kids considers race and inequity as a lens for understanding differentiated outcomes. Accordingly, we have made grants and sought leadership opportunities to create a more level playing field. Data show that nonprofits led by people of color receive less funding than nonprofits with white leadership teams. Strong Start implements best practices to engage with members of these underserved communities so that our grantmaking and decision-making are informed by direct feedback rather than by indirect needs assessments.

Listening to grantees, parents, and the provider community helps us gain perspective on where and how additional funding could have the most impact and will help shape our future investments.



Our focus on financial well-being

Vanguard is embarking on a new strategic philanthropic focus on financial well-being. Through grantmaking and collaborative partnerships, the goal is to support community-based organizations that expand access to evidence-based programs that improve the economic outlook for historically marginalized individuals and communities. This portfolio will also work to strengthen the nonprofit financial ecosystem in key Vanguard markets.

In focus: The Asset Funders Network

The Asset Funders Network (AFN), a Strong Start partner in Charlotte, Dallas, Philadelphia, and Phoenix, works with philanthropic partners on projects to help improve the long-term financial stability of low-income households.


AFN recently received a grant from Strong Start for their assistance in developing and refining a new "Financial Wellbeing Theory of Change." The project will help Vanguard to identify nonprofits focused on financial well-being and refine our grantmaking strategy for the future funding of these organizations.

My Classroom Economy modernization

Vanguard's My Classroom Economy® is an interactive program powered by volunteers that enables any educator to teach children financial literacy through fun, experiential learning. This free program has reached more than 1.2 million students, and 86% of educators have found the program to be effective in improving student financial responsibility. In 2023, My Classroom Economy continued to expand its reach to more classrooms and communities by launching a fully digital experience. The new platform enables teachers to customize the "economy" within their classroom to reflect the communities in which they live.

While My Classroom Economy has been accessible online since it launched in 2011, the materials teachers and students have used in the classroom have been exclusively available on paper or hard copy. Paper is still available, but the new digital interface will enhance the My Classroom Economy experience for **teachers, students, and administrators**. The online experience is organized, efficient, and easy to implement and integrate. It can be used in alignment with the paper version or stand by itself.



In focus: Strong Start for Kids program investments

Investment highlights

The data presented in this section reflect new project commitments approved from August 1, 2022, through December 31, 2023. We made 27 grants to 26 organizations, including new and long-standing partners, to continue projects that were generating positive results or to launch new initiatives. Priorities included responding to acute needs as the pandemic lingers and integrating our equity intentionality—supporting BIPOC-led organizations or targeted activities to increase inclusion and equitable opportunities.
